


Meet your Media Specialist, Mrs. Johnson.

December: Historical Fiction


• January: Fantasy

When you enter with a class...



- 1. Place your library book in the basket on the circulation desk.
 - 2. Have a seat at a table and wait quietly.
 - 3. Follow instructions for book check-out and renewal.

Location, location, location...

- MAGAZINES ARE LOCATED TO THE RIGHT AS YOU ENTER.
 - NEWSPAPERS ARE LOCATED IN THE BACK.

BIG BOOKS: a video for your enjoyment



Books are located just past the tables.

FICTION books are on the LEFT and are arranged by genre (and also in alphabetical order by author's last name within each genre).

NONFICTION books are located on the RIGHT.

Book Policies

Books can be checked out for 2 weeks at a time.


A late fee of 5 cents per day is charged for late books.

Let's do the math:

If you have 2 books checked out and those 2 books are 4 days late, and the fee is 5 cents per day, you will owe 20 cents for one book (1 book x 4 days) and 20 cents for the other book, for a total of 40 cents.

These fees can add up quickly, so please be mindful of your due dates!

Please take care of the books you borrow.
